Seed Mixes

Adirondack Wet Meadow Mix 1 oz. \$3.95 1/2 lb. \$25.95 1 lb \$45.95

This mix contains a variety of plants native to NY and the Adirondacks that are adapted to frequently inundated riparian habitats. Includes: Switchgrass, Virginia Wild Rye, Chewing's Fescue, Woolgrass, Green Bulrush, Devil's Beggartick, Spotted Joe-pye Weed, Common Boneset, Common Rush, Fringed Loosestrife, Sensitive Fern, New England Aster, and Blue Vervain. Seeding rate is 35 lbs per acre (1 oz covers approx 75 sq ft, 1/2 lb covers approx. 600 sq ft, 1 lb covers approx 1200 sq ft).

New York Meadow Mix 1 oz. \$2.95 1/2 lb. \$9.95 1 lb \$17.95

This mix contains a variety of plants native to NY that are adapted to upland areas with full sun. Includes: Little Bluestem, Switchgrass, Virginia Wild Rye, Eastern Gamagrass, Big Bluestem, Indiangrass, Partridge Pea, Coastal Panic Grass, Fowl Bluegrass, Black-eyed Susan, Common Milkweed, Oxeye Sunflower. Seeding rate is 15 lbs per acre (1 oz covers approx 175 sq ft, 1/2 lb covers approx 1400 sq ft, 1 lb covers approx 2800 sq ft).

Adirondack Native Lawn Mix 1/2 lb. \$7.95 1 lb. \$14.95

This mix contains Chewing's Fescue, Little Bluestem, Virginia Wild Rye, Autumn Bentgrass, and Rough Bentgrass. This is not a no-mow lawn, as these grasses can get 2-3' tall. But these grasses have much deeper roots, making them more drought tolerant and better able to withstand summer heat. You don't need to spend time and money watering and fertilizing a native lawn!
